We've been creating specific themes for the month and pushing into classes to do book talks. as much as possible.

I was finding students weren't really using our ebooks or weren't sure what to search to discover books. Similar to Patti's bimoji example, I have been promoting our ebooks on my library website using book cover images linked right to the ebook. This way students are able to browse. I linked up about 500 new ebooks and sorted by genre. This has been working and students are finally using our ebooks.

16:29:37 From Michelle Emerick to Everyone: A1: We have been promoting our public library resources as well for students who prefer physical books since we are remote.
